Where to Shoot

In this one I am going to pick a place and talk specifically about what they do at a match, and give an overview of what they have to offer.

Right next door to the Academy is the Phoenix Rod and Gun Club. It is located to the east of us and you can get there by driving down 7th Avenue.

On Thursdays they have a steel match from 1630-2000 hrs. and it costs \$8.00 (for LE personnel). They don't have prizes for this match but they mix up the stages and they are some good stages that don't take too long to shoot.

Different people take turns designing stages each week so the stages are fairly different week to week which makes it interesting. One guy makes a lot of the shots difficult and challenging while another likes to make everything close and big so it's real fast, and the others fall somewhere in between.

They also have other types of pistol matches to include Police L Matches, NRA 2700 Pistol Matches, Bullseye Matches, and it is big into IDPA and getting more involved in ICORE (revolvers). Proceeds from the Police L Matches are going to the Phoenix 100 Club.

They also have a high power rifle division, small bore rifle division, and they do things with juniors if interested.
